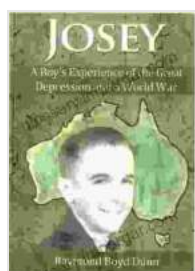


Josey Raymond Boyd Dunn: A Life of Courage and Adventure

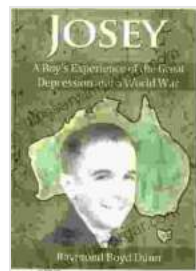

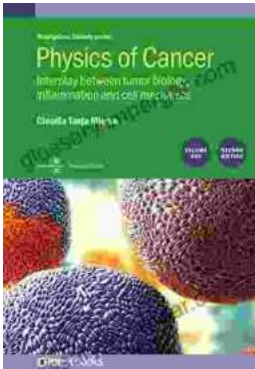
