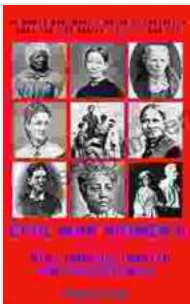

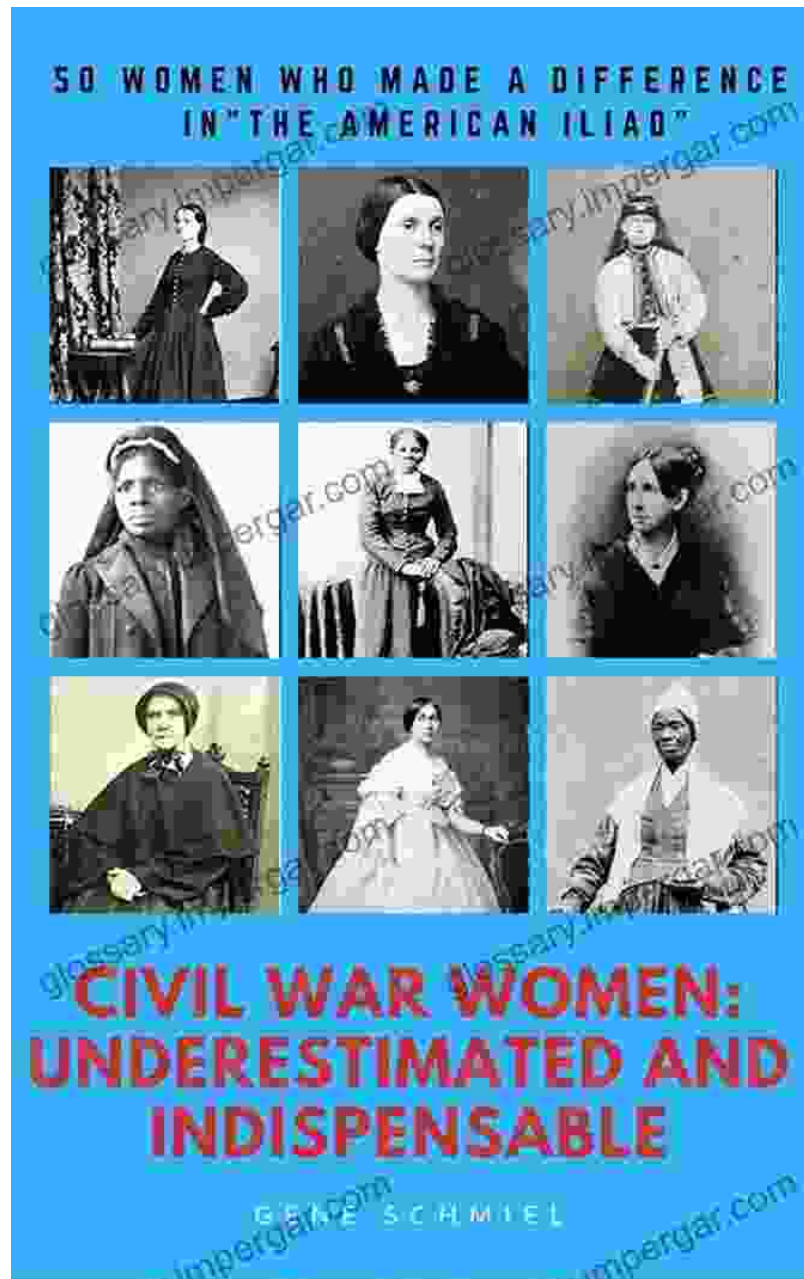

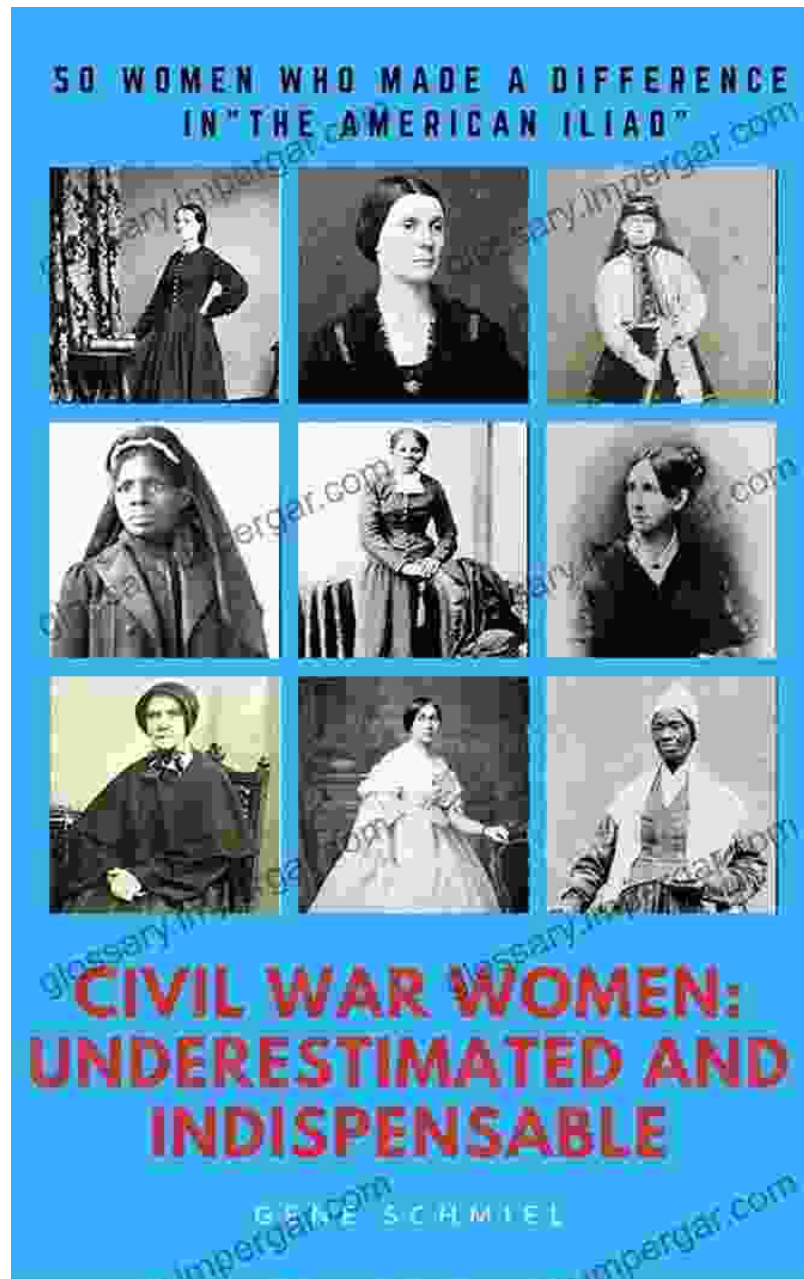

Military Leaders



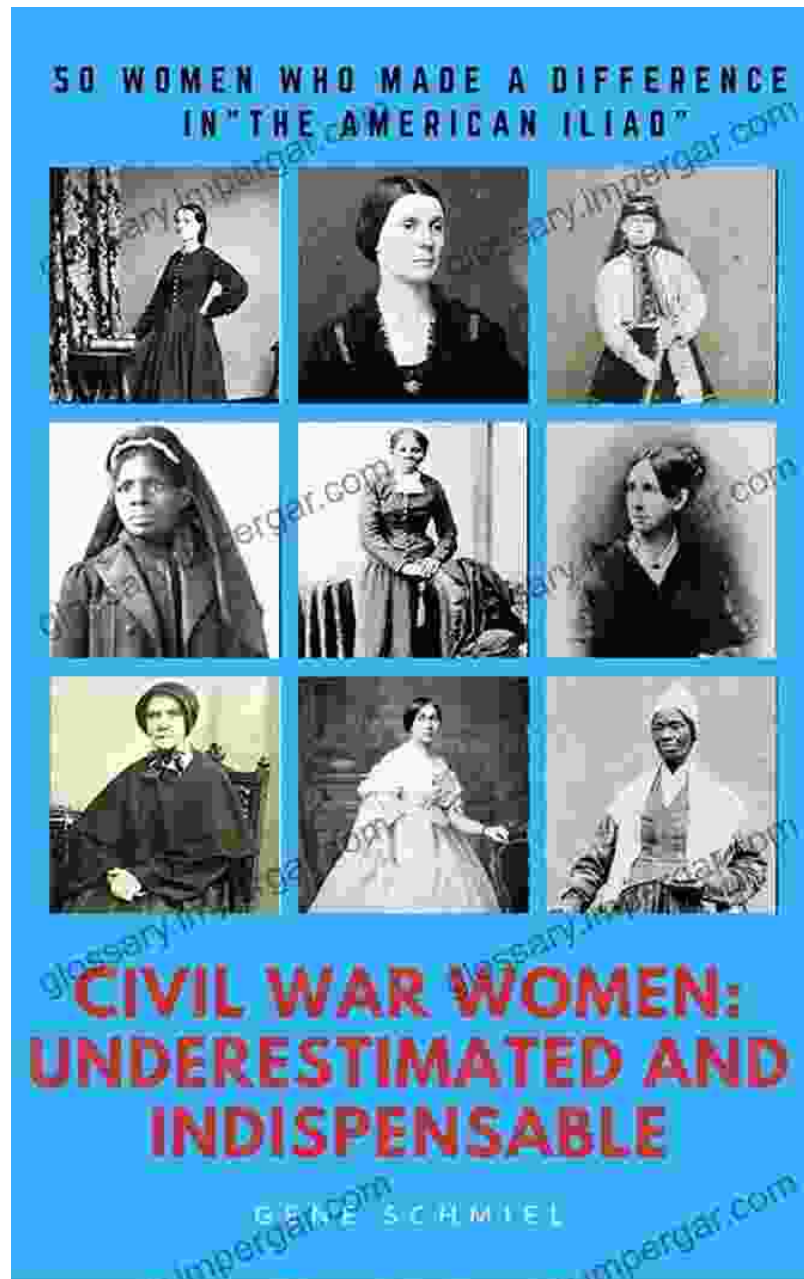
- **George Henry Thomas**

- **Joseph Hooker**

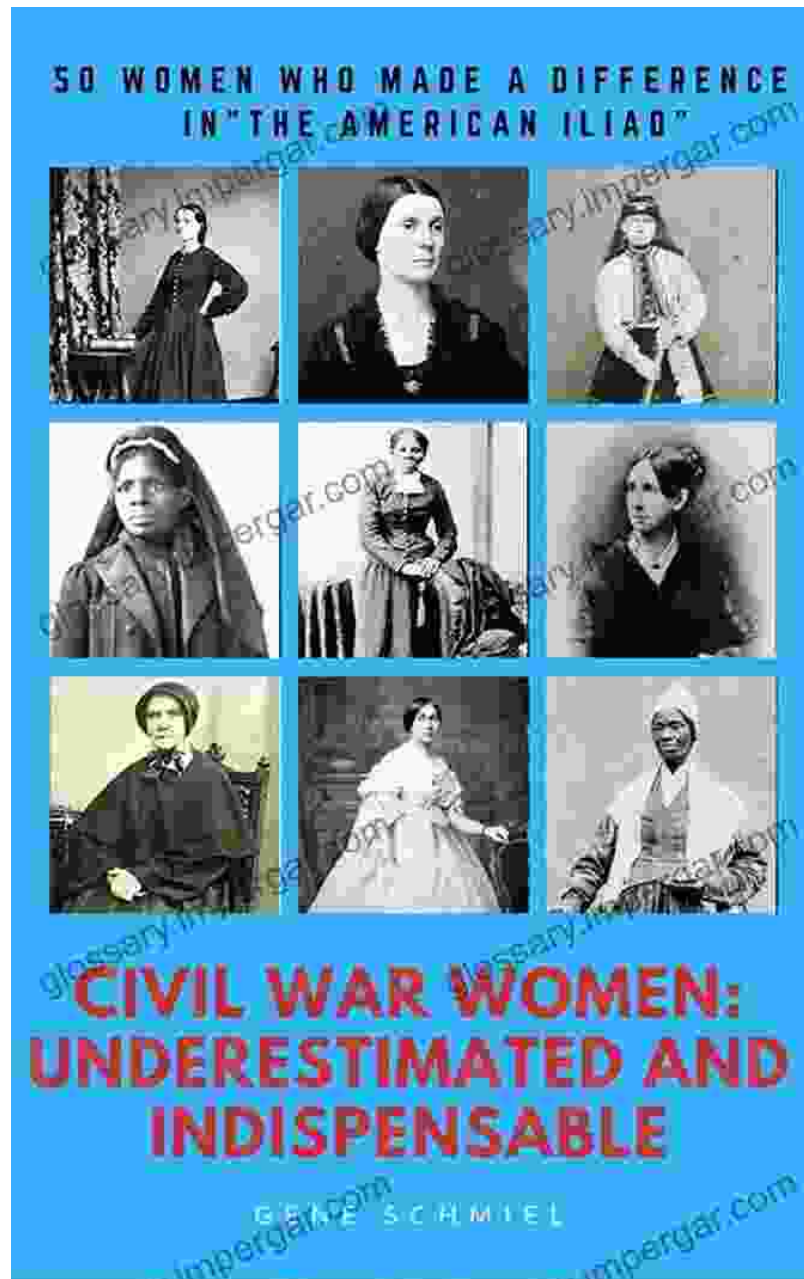

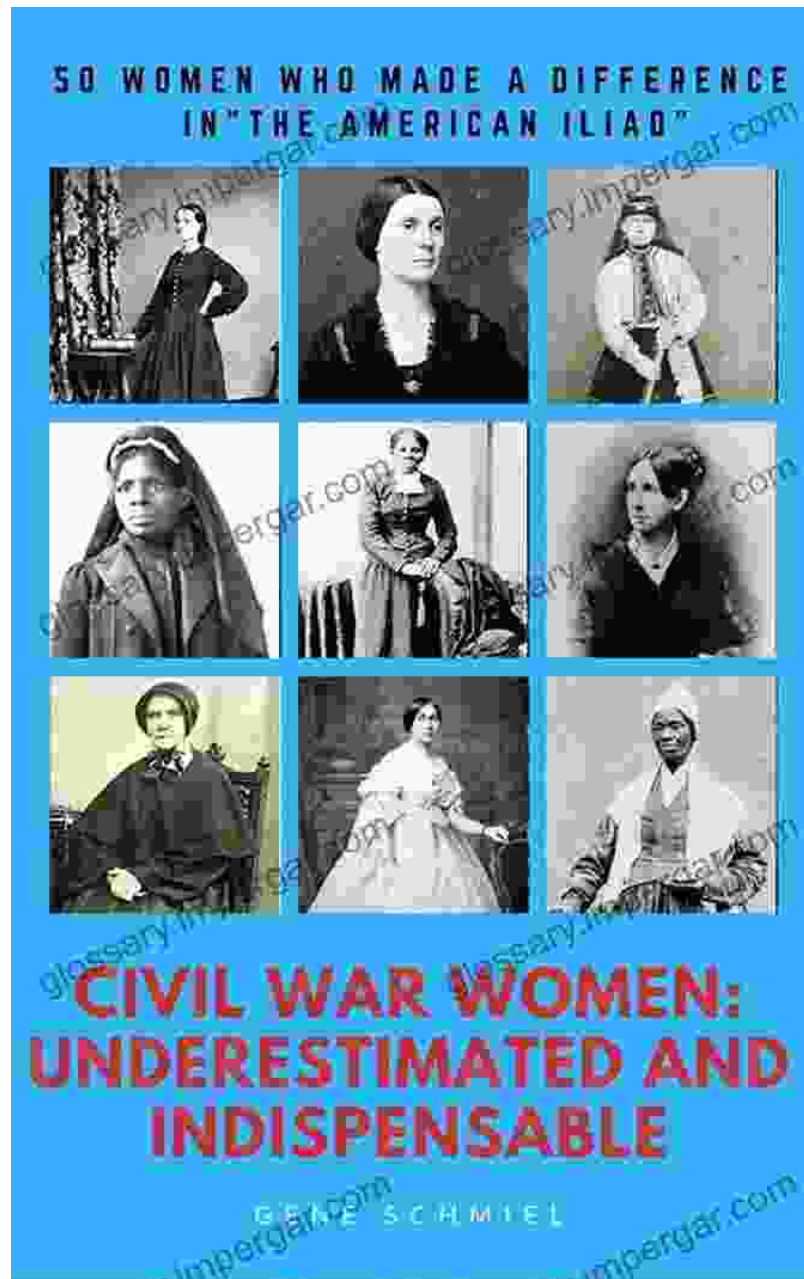
- **Frederick Douglass**

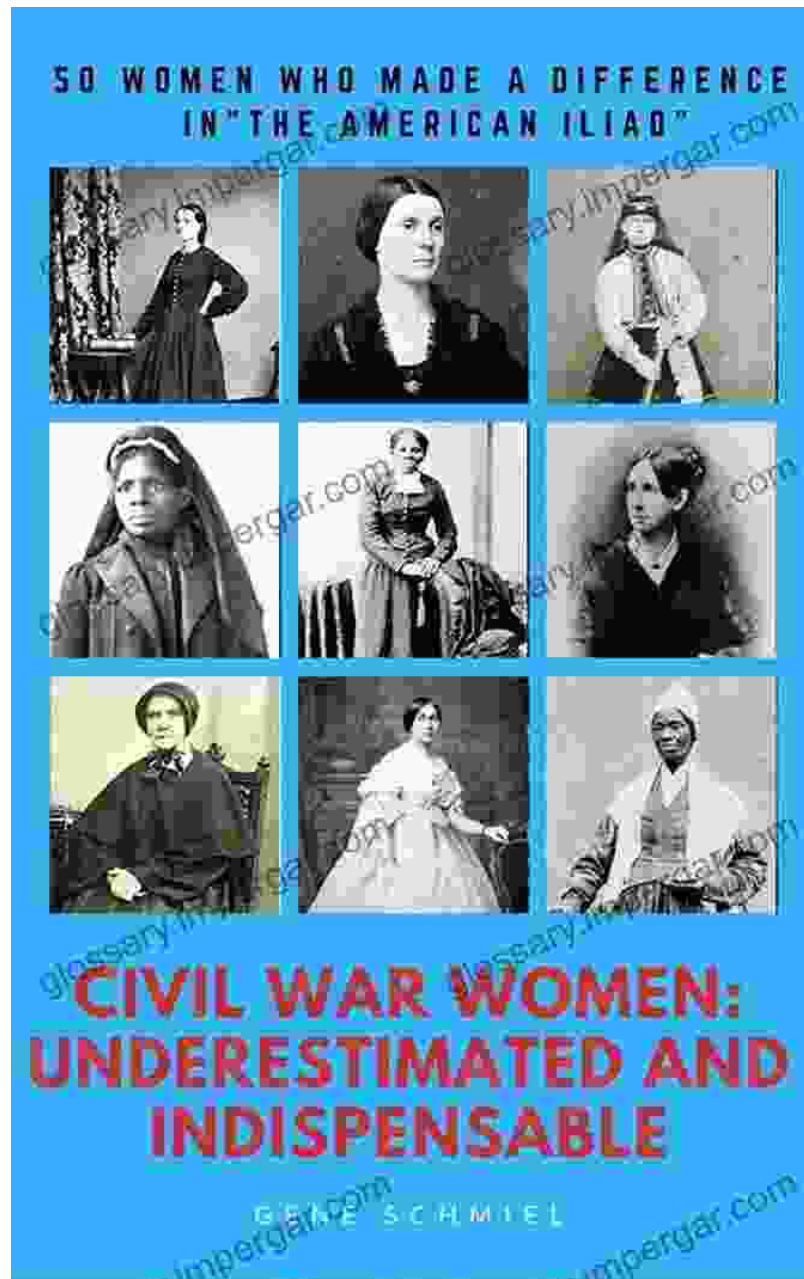

- May 12, 1862



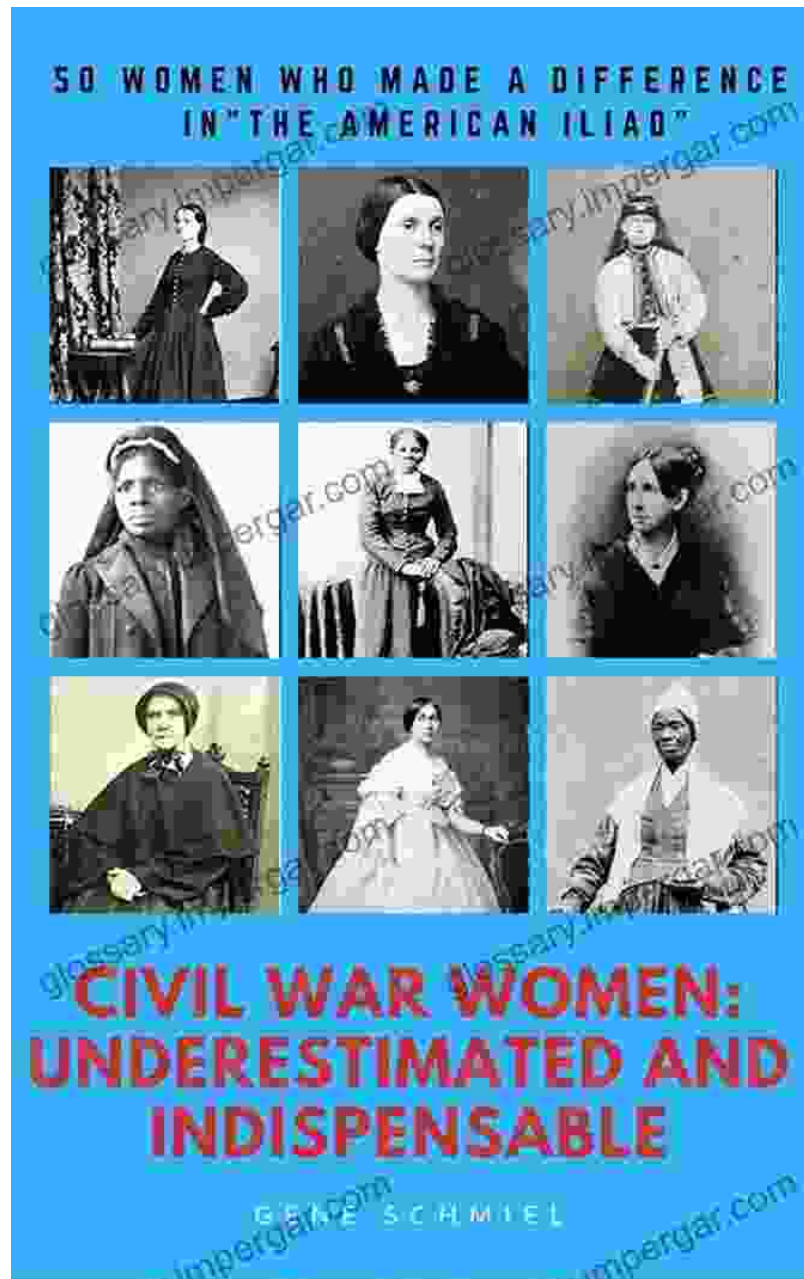
- **Anna Ella Carroll**

A political strategist and military advisor, Carroll played a key role in planning Union campaigns and is believed to have influenced President Lincoln's thinking.



- **Elizabeth Blackwell**

The first female doctor in the United States, Blackwell established a hospital for the wounded in Washington, D.C. and played a vital role in improving medical care for soldiers.



- **Sally Louisa Young**

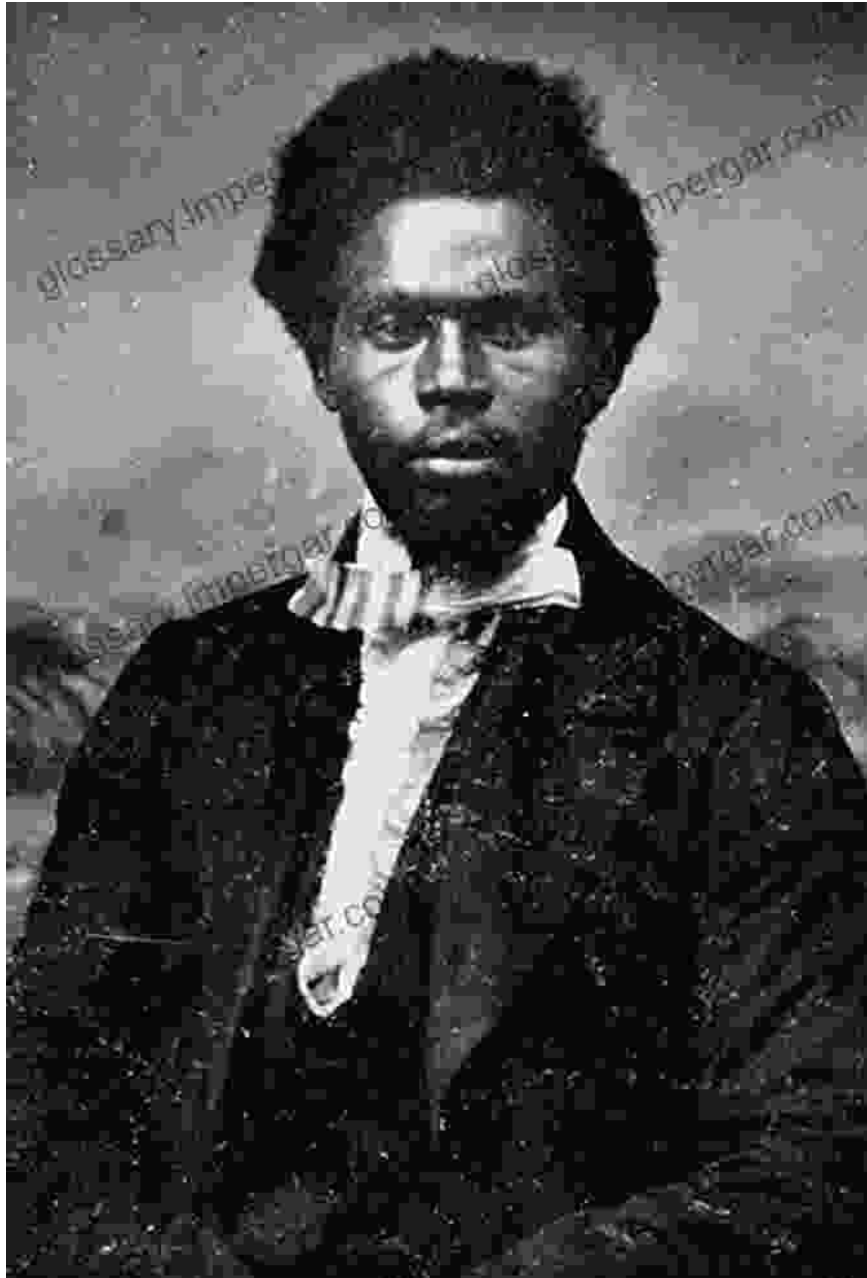
A Confederate woman who served as a spy and courier for the Army of Northern Virginia, Young provided valuable information that helped shape the course of the war.

African Americans



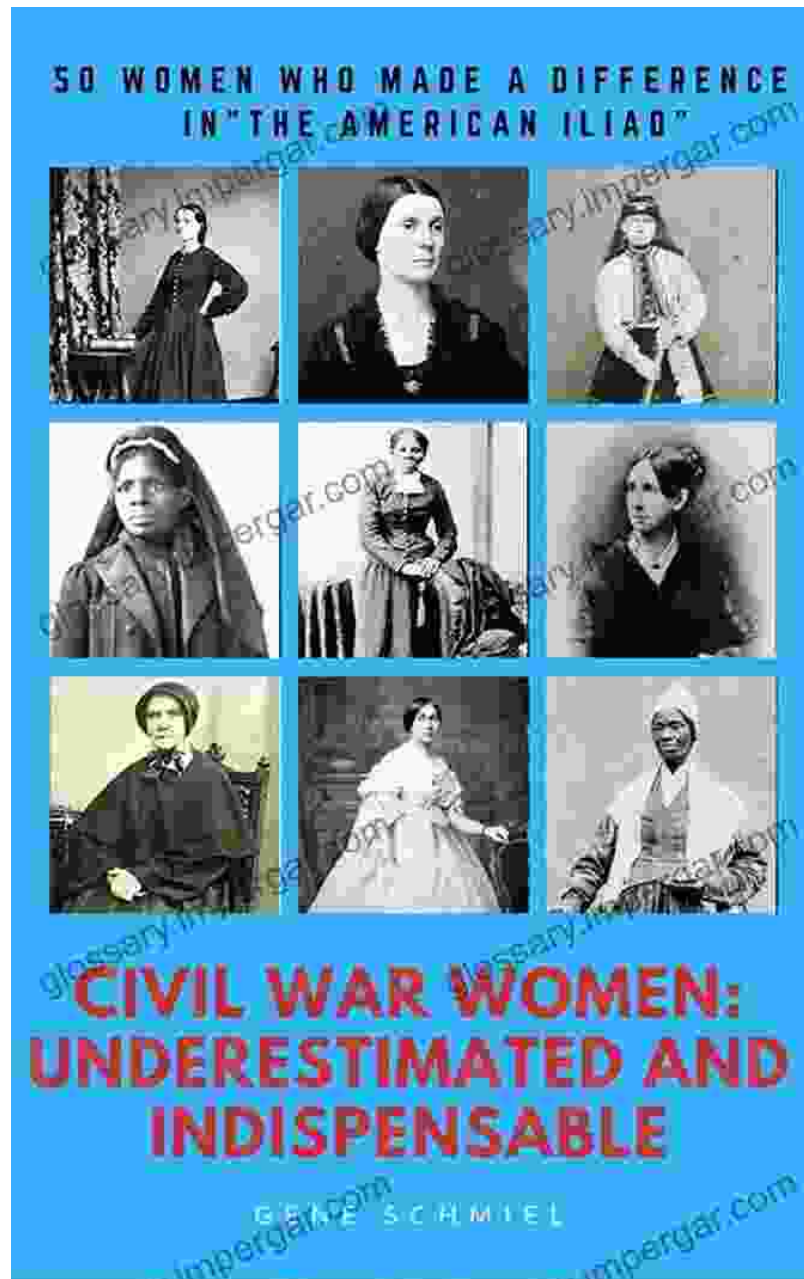
- **Martin Robison Delany**

- **John Mercer Langston**

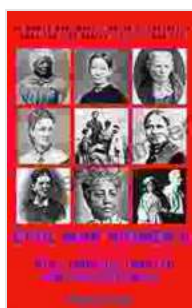
A lawyer, educator, and politician, Langston was one of the first African Americans elected to public office after the Civil War.

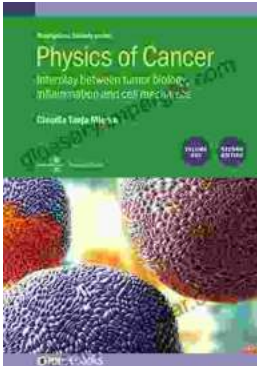
